
COA	Cost of Attendance A college's sticker price
EFC	Expected Family Contribution What colleges think you can pay annually
Need	Eligibility for need-based financial aid Your <b>potential</b> discount from the sticker price
Need-Based Grant	A discount Sample Student Family could receive if the family's EFC is less than a college's COA
Merit-Based Scholarship	A discount Sample Student Family could receive based on GPA and SAT/ACT scores
Net Cost	COA - Grants and Scholarships



#### NOW WHAT?

Sample Student Family will **NOT** be eligible for need-based grants at most public colleges, but **WILL** be eligible at most private colleges.

Sample Student Family will also be eligible for merit-based scholarships at some colleges!




