Here are a few terms you need to understand.

COA	Cost of Attendance A college's sticker price
SAI	Student Aid Index What colleges think you can pay annually
Need	Eligibility for need-based financial aid Your potential discount from the sticker price
Need-Based Grant	A discount Sample Student could receive if the family's SAI is less than a college's COA
Merit-Based Scholarship	A discount Sample Student could receive based on GPA and SAT/ACT scores
Net Cost	COA - Grants and Scholarships

\$45K Need Eligibility



NOW WHAT?

Sample Student will **NOT** be eligible for need-based grants at most public colleges, but **WILL** be eligible at most private colleges.

Sample Student will also be eligible for merit-based scholarships at some colleges!






